CURRENT LINES OF RESEARCH: ACTION RESEARCH MODEL

- My more significant projects follow an Action Research Model. Action research involves a variety of research methodologies and imbeds the researcher in organizations as a change agent. Most of the listed projects focus on my main areas of interest at this time, Project Management, Strategic Planning, Leadership Development and Research Methodologies. My main emphasis at this time is in how organizations deal with change through the process of creating shared leadership, strategies and leverage. I am also working with a variety of methods of analysis including both focus groups (I have conducted over 200 focus groups and other interviews). My main interest at this time is a meta-analysis of the different studies. I am developing a variety of models during this process. Strategic Planning, Leadership and Research Methods. All three models have progressed through the schematic stages and I am currently working on white papers and monographs on them. I have become fascinated with the use of concept maps to create and link constructs.
- Dr. Ernest Boyer refers to four levels of scholarship in his classic work, "Scholarship Reconsidered". These four levels are:
 - Scholarship of Discovery (the highest level)
 - Scholarship of Integration
 - Scholarship of Application
 - Scholarship of Teaching (in the beginning)

I believe that I have appropriately focused on the first two levels of Application and Teaching in my journey as a scholar until I was promoted to Full Professor. Since 2000 I have been moving into more

of the Scholarship of Integration & Discovery. I am working on projects relating to Leadership, Cultural Change & Transformation, Research Methods and Strategic Planning in these areas. I am continuing my process of building both breadth and depth in my areas of expertise. And, I am looking for opportunities at this time to move that work to fruition and further development. The outcomes of the efforts in Integration will certainly be seen in both Application and Teaching. The integrated models will take the form of causal maps to guide both students and practitioners.

- A series of white papers on project management, research, leadership and communication topics
- A concept map delineating the multiple interconnected constructs in research methodologies
