- 2. Copy of unofficial transcripts.
- 3. You must have completed at least one Chicano Studies course and earned a minimum of a 2.0 grade (not including CHST 196,197,297). Not required but highly recommended.
- 4. You must be able to intern for a minimum 8 weeks. No exceptions.
- 5. All Executive Interns will begin on the same date.
- Two reference letters, one must be from EWU faculty (not a CHST faculty).

Sea Mar Community Health Centers was organized by a group of Latino community leaders and health activists who dreamed of developing a comprehensive health center for the Latino community in Seattle, with satellite clinics in rural communities in western Washington. They began in 1978 with one small clinic in the South Park neighborhood of Seattle. Today, Sea Mar is one of western Washington's largest providers of community-based health and human services, including community and migrant primary medical and dental care, obstetrics and gynecology, minor outpatient surgery, laboratory and radiology services, outpatient and inpatient behavioral health and substance abuse treatment services, social services and case management, maternity support services, migrant and homeless support services, health education and nutrition programs, pharmacy services, community- and facilitybased long-term care services, child care, low-income and migrant farm worker housing, and youth education and leadership programs.
