EWU Graduates First Cohort of Nurses

This spring, EWU's School of Nursing graduated its first-ever cohort of nurses. This historic group of students is the first to complete the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Program and—perhaps equally impressive—all 40 students who began the program graduated together at the May 2 semester commencement ceremony. Washington state ranks in the top quarter of U.S. states facing severe nursing shortages. Our graduates are stepping up to meet the need and make a difference in our region; 39 of the 40 graduates plan to remain in state.

"Nursing is an applied discipline, so they started semester one in a skills lab and in a clinical setting working with patients," says Donna Bachand, nursing program administrator and department chair, who designed and spearheaded the program. "I'm very proud of the work the faculty have done, the contribution these students have made, and the staff who are so committed to their success."
